October 19 is our Grand Opening for Olympic Community of Schools!

**October 27** is Olympic Homecoming. The game starts at 7.

Starting with this year's ninth graders, all students must pass five different EOC tests in order to graduate from North Carolina High Schools.

Advisory/Homeroom at Renaissance is called "Forum." It has a set curriculum that is made up from all subject areas, and composes 10% of all students' grades. Here, students investigate colleges and careers.

## NOTES FROM PRINCIPAL MELODY SEARS

Greetings! By now, you know that our teachers have been busy creating and delivering lesson plans with varied activities designed to actively engage students in the learning process, with excellent responses from our students. We have already given out our progress reports on September 21 and 22! We had our Academic Open House on September 26. If you discover that your student is having academic difficulty, schedule a conference, now! Remember that Forum is a scheduled activity that incorporates skills from all Renaissance curriculum areas, and counts 10% of all grades. Also remember that there is a community service based learning component that goes with Renaissance School, and will be handled through Forum. More information will be coming out, but this should not be news to parents in Renaissance, as we have been working on this since last year in design teams for the school, mentioning it in newsletters, and talking about it in forum with students for quite some time. Seniors will be using their Senior Exit Project to serve as their community projects. Starting with this year's ninth grade, all students must pass five of their EOC tests as a requirement for graduation. Parents, please take an active part in your student's success by helping set a regular time and place in the home for student daily study. It is important for you to know what your student has for homework each night. During the week of October 16-20, your student will have mid-quarter exams. On the 18th, we will give the PSAT to freshmen, sophomores, and juniors. All these tests are required.

On September 13, the Charlotte group, "Gang of One" presented valuable information about youth and organized gang activity to our community's parents. We held a **student and faculty information session assembly** with the same group during school on **October 10**. The presentation for parents was so well received, we are in the process of scheduling the presentation again for a future PTO meeting. At the next PTO meeting, to be held in our school's media center on October 18 from 6:00-7:30 P.M., there will be a presentation on signs of substance and alcohol abuse in teens. On October 25th, from 6:30—8 P.M., there will be a presentation on Internet Predators and what parents need to know about keeping their children safe. We plan to hold useful parent information sessions at each PTO session. Please come out and support your children and their teachers. We are having a Renaissance School t-shirt design contest. All entries should be in by October 31! Students, see Ms. Vaughan or forum reps for details.

## That Do Not Cost a Thing
